What's the Story?

Robin and I have just returned from a long weekend in Chicago. It was cold while we were there, which we anticipated when we made plans to go there in February. However, the weather didn't keep us from having a great trip! I attended a two-day symposium at the seminary I attended, on Biblical Hospitality and Immigration. We listened to six professors present papers on the topic from different perspectives; Old Testament, New Testament, Theological, Political Science and Ministry. Each of the papers was then responded to be a different professor. Then the rest of us were given time to ask questions.

We were also able to connect with some "old" friends (this summer it will be 20 years ago that we moved to Chicago to attend seminary), as well as some family. My dad's aunt raised her family in a suburb of Chicago and five of his six cousins still live there. We told a lot of

stories while we visited with them. Some of the stories were about our memories of the time that we lived in Chicago and were able to spend time with my dad's cousins. And other stories were older, family stories about our grandparents, great-grandparents and great great-grandparents. It soon became obvious that we can't remember all of the details of the family stories that we have heard. Names and places have been forgotten but, more importantly, the stories of our relatives have become less accurate with the passing of each generation.

Stories will be our focus this Lent, both God's Story and Our Story. We will explore God's story each Sunday as we read and hear some of Jesus' parables, as told in Luke, preached about during worship. Our daily devotional and a daily video will also focus upon God's Story. And in our small group gatherings we will read and hear stories from Scripture, as well as the stories of the authors and contributors to our small group curriculum. We will also hear parts of each person in our small group's story. Our hope is that we will become more comfortable telling stories about how God's story intersects with each of our stories, throughout the Lenten season.

Then, during Holy Week we will hear Peter's story about the passion of Jesus, which will be sung and spoken by our Easter choir.

I invite you to make Lent at Ascension a part of your story this year.

January is off to a good start with Income exceeding budget, and expenses below budget. However, these numbers reflect some annual and quarterly gifts, so that has to be taken into consideration when spread across several months.

A new benevolence distribution of our offerings has been approved by the finance committee and the council. We will still be designating 11.2% of all offering (Regular and Restricted) as benevolences each month. However, now 7.5% of the Regular offering will be dedicated to the Synod and the Synod supported ministries. The remaining 3.2% of Regular offering will support our congregation and our community designated ministries.

All 11.2% of the Restricted Offering will support our congregation and our community ministries each month.




Pub Theology

Are You the Next Ministry Partner?

We are in need of folks we can equip to partner in ministry to help us continue to provide meaningful worship services. The needs are great but the burden, when shared, can be light. Together we can make a difference. Below is a brief overview of each of the areas in which partners are involved, along with the name of a person currently serving in that position who is available to answer questions you may have.

On March 16, between services and after second service, you'll have the opportunity to see this work in action. If you're interested in serving in any of these capacities, there will be training offered as well as support provided as you serve.

Altar Guild: Basic duties revolve around total care of the altar and chancel for worship. This includes linens and the communion elements. See Dana Maroney for details.

Assisting Minister: The Assisting Minister provides leadership during specific parts of the worship service and assists the presiding minister with communion preparation and distribution; leads prayers and dismissal. See Dana Maroney for details.

Coffee Hour: Purchase donuts (for which you are reimbursed), make coffee & set out creamers, etc., place donuts (and baked goods donated by members) on platters at the end of Classic Service. Wipe down tables, put supplies away and wash dishes after Modern Service begins. See Kay Emery for details.

Communion Assistant: Communion Assistants assist the Pastor in distribution of Holy Communion, both bread and wine. See Dana Maroney for details.

Lector: The Lector reads the week's lesson from the lectern. A copy of the text is emailed ahead of time, affording the opportunity to rehearse in advance. See Terri Jellesed for details.

Usher: Ushers great members and guests as they arrive for worship, tally attendance, collect the offering, and provide direction to the communion rail. See Paul Bacchi for details

Table & Chair Set Up/Take Down: Set up tables and chairs in the Fellowship Hall before Coffee Hour; take down tables and chairs after Coffee Hour. Also the table on which pastries are served. See Justin Carballar for details.

Tech Team: Following written guidelines engage appropriate camera shots; advance pre-programmed words on screen; activate specific microphones at appropriate times. See Andrea Toven, Shane Toven or Brian Peterson for details.

Loaves & Fishes



Sunrise Christian Food Ministry


