

"Sunrise"

In Cromwell, Connecticut the Christian Clergy Group hosted a sunrise Easter service every year at the river. We always had a rain plan, but in the nine Easters that we were there, we never needed it. One year we had to move the service to higher ground, because the water level was so high, but we were still able to gather, always looking toward the east, to worship as the sun rose. It remains a favorite memory of our time in Cromwell.

Throughout Lent we have been focusing upon God's Story; Our Story, and we have been encouraged to share our stories about when God's Story has impacted each of our stories. As I think about the Son rising this Easter, I am reminded of another sunrise that left an impression on me. It was when I was a camper at Mt. Cross Lutheran Camp, in Felton, CA. I was probably in middle school at the time. There was an adult "camper" who was paraplegic, I think his name was Jeff. Jeff was staying in the nice rooms in Jensen Hall for the week. He

had an aide with him, but I remember that we were either encouraged, or assigned, to assist him with some daily tasks. I think that was a good experience, but also made me uncomfortable.


Our cabin decided that one morning we would hike up the fire road above the camp to watch the sunrise. And we decided to take Jeff with us. So, Jeff was strapped into a rescue stretcher, like the ones that they strap injured people in to carry them off of a mountain. And we took turns carrying Jeff up and down the mountain, so that he could see the sunrise with us. It was a lot of work, and a little bit scary being responsible for Jeff, but it was amazing. We all enjoyed seeing the sunrise, but it was even more magical seeing Jeff's reaction to the light of the sun piercing the morning sky.

Whenever I read about the paralyzed man whose friends lowered him through the roof in order for him to see Jesus, I think about carrying Jeff up and down the mountain to see the sunrise. I also think that we saw Jesus that day, not just in the rising of the sun, but in the loving act of carrying a man who was unable to get himself safely up or down that mountain. It would have been easier to hike up and down this mountain without Jeff, but it also wouldn't have had the impact upon my story that it did.

What's your story? How has God's story impacted your story? What not share it with someone?



Sunrise Christian Food Ministry

Seven Ascension volunteers sorted and packed root vegetables on Wednesday, March 19, to be given to low-income clients along with bags of groceries.

Started in 1983, Sunrise Christian Food Ministry is located at Advent Lutheran Church. Supported by a large group of local congregations, it is one of the largest food banks in the Sacramento area. The food bank provides monthly emergency food distributions for Citrus Heights, Fair Oaks and Orangevale. The number of families served has **increased 6-fold**.






Clothing and Book Donations

Francis House

One of the recipients of the gently used clothing donated by our members and friends is Francis House in downtown Sacramento. During the month of March we delivered 13 bags of clothing.

Francis House Center is part of the Next Move Homeless Services in Sacramento. Their goal is to serve those suffering homelessness and poverty. Their mission is to provide relief, resources and hope to transform individuals and families from a struggle for survival to a plan for their success.

Some of the direct services they provide are: Bus passes, California ID's, Notary services, Hygiene kits, Eyeglasses, Winter coats, scarves, hats, gloves (when available), Resource Coaching. They have a Job Development Center to help their clients become gainfully employed, as well as transportation support to help them get to their first paycheck. They also provide motel vouchers for homeless families.



WHAT WE BELIEVE:


In the very beginning, there was just Jesus.....and, of course, his disciples. The disciples became apostles, filled with God's love and the power of the Spirit, and the church, established by Jesus and spread by the Apostles, grew and prospered for about 1500 years.

But there were some problems:

In 1517, a young monk who was also a priest and also a University Professor teaching Biblical Studies suggested that maybe a few changes were in order. Dr. Martin Luther did not want to start a new church but he did want to get back to some important basics. Unfortunately, the people at the top weren't really open to change, so the churches that were following Dr. Luther's ideas broke away from the Roman Catholic church and the Lutheran Church was born. Please note that Luther never, ever wanted the new church to be called "Lutheran". The name came from those who mocked his followers, and it stuck.

The central pillars of Lutheran theology are the four onlys which Dr. Luther spelled out clearly in 1520.

- 1. Only Grace--we can only be saved by God's grace. It's a gift that God gives us—not anything we can earn, no matter how good we try to be.
- 2. Only Faith--only faith can bring us to God's grace. Faith equals trust. When we trust in God's goodness and love we experience God's Grace.
- 3. Only Scripture—our doctrine must conform to God's word as it comes to us through the Bible.
- 4. Only Christ... Jesus Christ is the Living Word of God. The Scriptures point to Christ. He is the object of our faith and the One who brings us God's grace.



"The Cost of Discipleship" is a 1937 book by Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German theologian, which explores the meaning of following Christ, particularly through an exposition of the Sermon on the Mount. Bonhoeffer emphasizes the challenges and sacrifices involved in true discipleship, arguing that it requires a commitment to live according to Christ's teachings, even at great personal cost. The book is considered a classic of Christian thought and continues to inspire discussions on the nature of faith and obedience.

Who was Bonhoeffer?

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a German Lutheran pastor, neoorthodox theologian and anti-Nazi dissident who was a key founding member of the Confessing Church. His writings on Christianity's role in the secular world have become widely influential; his 1937 book The Cost of Discipleship is described as a modern classic.[1]Apart from his theological writings, Bonhoeffer was known for his staunch resistance to the Nazi dictatorship. including vocal opposition to Adolf Hitler's euthanasia program and genocidal persecution of Jews. He was arrested in April 1943 by the Gestapo and imprisoned at Tegel Prison for 1½ years. Later, he was transferred to Flossenbürg concentration camp.

Bonhoeffer was accused of being associated with the 20 July plot to assassinate Hitler and was tried along with other accused plotters, including former members of the Abwehr (the German Military Intelligence Office). He was hanged on 9 April 1945 during the collapse of the Nazi regime.

Loving God—Mark 12:30 "you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, all your mind, and with all your strength."


