

The next session of this group is going to be October 12th after second service. Keep an eye out for sign-up!



October is **Breast Cancer Awareness Month**. On average, every 2 minutes a woman is diagnosed with breast cancer, but there is hope.

With better screening and early detection, along with improved treatment options, the 5-year relative survival rate in the United States of early-stage breast cancer is 99%. It is also important to note that there are currently over 4 million breast cancer survivors in the United States.







As part of our effort to support those impacted by breast cancer, either directly or indirectly, we are highlighting the National Breast Cancer Foundation.
